## Peterborough-Kawartha voters value local TV

According to a recent riding survey for the Friends of Canadian Broadcasting conducted by Nanos, Peterborough-Kawartha voters value local TV, trust the CRTC to protect CHEX-TV, and believe that CHEX-TV contributes to making their community stronger.

## Local TV in my community

Peterborough-Kawartha voters value local TV, want their Member of Parliament to work to keep local broadcasting in Peterborough strong, trust the CRTC to protect their local TV station, and believe that local TV contributes to making their community stronger.

- Local TV's value to Peterborough-Kawartha voters - Four in five voters agree (59\%) or somewhat agree (21\%) that local news on CHEX-TV in Peterborough is valuable to them. Respondents who would consider voting for the Liberal Party as their first choice value local TV news the most as $65 \%$ agree or $20 \%$ somewhat agree, followed by the NDP ( $68 \%$ agree and $13 \%$ somewhat agree), and the Conservatives ( $46 \%$ and $23 \%$, respectively).
- $\quad$ Stop broadcasting local news - More than four in five respondents disagree (74\%) or somewhat disagree (8\%) with the statement that they would not care if CHEX-TV in Peterborough stopped broadcasting local news. Among residents (voters) who would consider voting for the NDP as their first choice, $85 \%$ disagree or $4 \%$ somewhat disagree with the statement, followed by Liberal Party supporters ( $73 \%$ disagree and $9 \%$ somewhat disagree), Conservative Party supporters ( $69 \%$ and $12 \%$, respectively), and Green Party supporters ( $31 \%$ and $30 \%$, respectively).
- Trust the CRTC to protect local TV stations - Most voters agree (44\%) or somewhat agree (22\%) that they trust the CRTC to make decisions that will ensure that their local TV station is not forced to close. Three in four respondents ( $48 \%$ agree and $28 \%$ somewhat agree) that would consider voting for the NDP as their first choice trust the CRTC to protect news on their local TV station, followed by the Liberals ( $40 \%$ and $24 \%$, respectively), and the Conservatives (34\% and 26\%, respectively).
- MP's role in keeping local broadcasting strong - More than nine in ten residents agree (78\%)or somewhat agree (15\%) that their federal Member of Parliament should work to keep local broadcasting strong in their community. Among voters that would consider voting for the NDP as their first choice, agree (84\%) or somewhat agree (11\%), followed by both the Liberals ( $78 \%$ and $12 \%$, respectively) and the Conservatives ( $65 \%$ and $24 \%$, respectively).
- Role of local TV in the community - Almost nine in ten voters agree (67\%) or somewhat agree (21\%) that CHEX-TV contributes to making their community stronger. Among those who would consider voting for the NDP as their first choice, agree (69\%) or somewhat agree (26\%), followed by the Liberals ( $69 \%$ and $20 \%$, respectively), and the Conservatives (69\% and 14\%, respectively).

These observations are based on an RDD dual frame (land- and cell-lines) random telephone survey of 300 voters of the Federal Electoral District of Peterborough-Kawartha, 18 years of age or older, conducted between August $25^{\text {th }}$ and $26^{\text {th }}$, 2015 by Nanos Research. The research was commissioned by Friends of Canadian Broadcasting. The margin of error for a random survey of 300 voters of the Federal Electoral District of Peterborough-Kawartha is $\pm 5.7$ percentage points, 19 times out of 20.

## Methodology

Nanos conducted an RDD dual frame (land- and cell-line) random telephone survey of 300 voters of the Federal Electoral District of Peterborough-Kawartha, 18 years of age or older, was conducted between August $25^{\text {th }}$ and $26^{\text {th }}$, 2015 by Nanos Research. Participants were randomly recruited by telephone using live agents and administered a survey. The sample included both land- and cell-lines across Peterborough-Kawartha. The results were statistically checked and weighted by age and gender using the latest Census information and the sample is geographically stratified to be representative of Peterborough-Kawartha.

Individuals randomly called using random digit dialling with a maximum of five call backs.

The margin of error for a random survey of 300 voters of the Federal Electoral District of Peterborough-Kawartha is $\pm 5.7$ percentage points, 19 times out of 20 .
